### Attendance at School

Education in New South Wales is compulsory for all children between the ages of six years and 17 years.

Once enrolled, children are required to attend school each day it is open for students.

Following an absence from school you must ensure that *within 7 days* you provide your child's school with a verbal or written explanation for the absence. However, if the school has not received an explanation from you within 2 days, the school may contact you to discuss the absence. *If no explanation is received within 7 days, the absence will be recorded as an unexplained absence.*
