Jump Rope for Heart

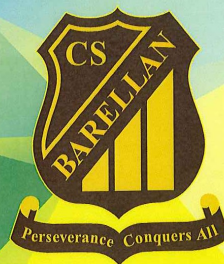
On Friday 16 September, Primary and Secondary classes participated in a "Marathon Skip-off".
