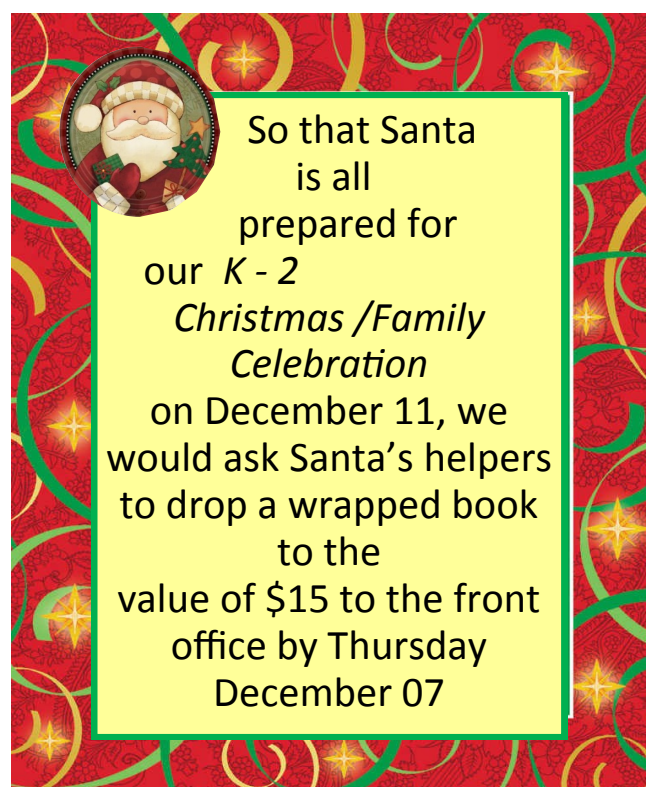

The Melbourne Cup By 2/3

The Melbourne Cup is an annual thoroughbred horse race over 3200 metres, held every year since 1861 on the first Tuesday in November at 3pm.

Over time the Melbourne Cup has grown and grown. And as the sport grew so did the amount of prize money! The winner of the Cup now takes home more than three and a half million dollars! But events like the Melbourne Cup have come to be about more than just the horses. Many have come to treat race days as important social events. And like any big party, fashion became a big element here too. The Melbourne Cup became such an important event that Melbourne Cup Day became a public holiday in Victoria!

But the Melbourne Cup wasn't just about money. As racing grew in popularity some of the best horses like the legendary Phar Lap captured the imagination of Australians.

The thoroughbred became a hero to many Australians winning 37 of his 51 races and even starring in films!

Today, more than 100,000 people flock to the Flemington Racecourse to celebrate the Melbourne Cup each year and about 650 million people worldwide tune in to watch it!

The race that stops the nation started all those years ago as a competition between some of the fastest horses around. A display of strength power and skill. And down on the track that's what the Melbourne Cup is still about.

2/3 took part in the Melbourne Cup celebrations by participating in our own class sweep and designing and creating fascinators and ties and bow ties. Don't we look fabulous!



Men's Health Education Rural Van (MHERV) is out and about in rural NSW.

MHERV's job is to shine a light into the future for rural blokes. With a few simple tests, shining light may reflect green, amber or bright red! Just about anything that the MHERV tests show can be easily treated by a local family doctor. But if it's an amber or red light it may need to be soon.

It's a five minute non-invasive group of tests:

- blood sugar, just to heart isn't too stressed
- Blood sugar levels - just a pin prick in the finger, to make sure there's no type two diabetes, which is manageable even if there is
- Cholesterol - another pin prick to see if levels are high and need attention
- There's also a bowel test for cancer - we'll provide the kit but that needs to be done later at home

In the past MHERV has shown us a bright red light and lives have been saved. A health check with MHERV is completely free, it is a community service sponsored by Rotary. Contact Community Health Centre for more details.
