# PRIMARY POST – 2/3 CLASS NEWS

What a wonderful term of learning we have had at BCS!

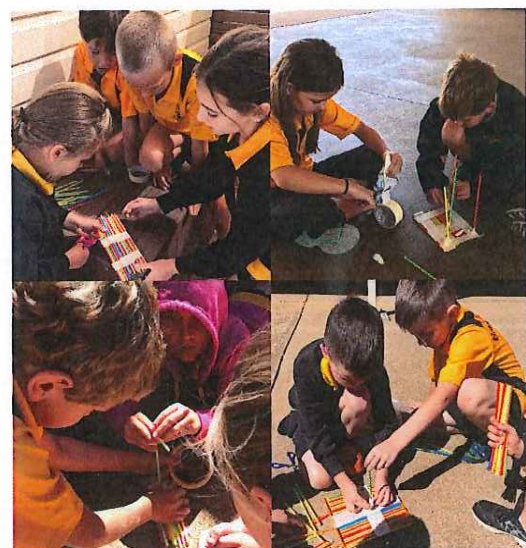
This term, year 2/3 have been engaging in STEM (Science, technology, engineering and mathematics) activities. STEM activities offer hands-on, and inquiry-based experiences and develops a set of thinking, reasoning, teamwork, investigative, and creative skills that students can use in all areas of their lives.

One of the challenges that were a highlight for the students was the Raft Building Challenge. Students were put into four groups and given straws, scissors and a roll of masking tape. Students were asked to construct a raft that could float on water and hold the largest amount of marbles without sinking. After 10 minutes of planning and 15 minutes of constructing, students were given time to test their rafts before the “official float”. All four rafts constructed floated and held a minimum of 8 marbles before sinking. The winning raft (with a straw flag and all) constructed by Zeek, Levi, Bailey, Koby and Tim, held a total of 22 marbles before sinking.

It was rewarding to see the students in an active/interactive mode, working together, asking questions, identifying objects, making comparisons, making predictions, testing ideas, and sharing discoveries all while having fun!

## Intention to apply: Year 5 entry to an opportunity class in 2018

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Dear Parent/Carer

Opportunity classes cater for highly achieving academically gifted students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. These classes help gifted and talented students to learn by grouping them with other gifted and talented students, teaching them in specialised ways and providing educational materials at the appropriate level.

Applications for opportunity class placement are considered mainly on the combined results of the Opportunity Class Placement Test and school assessments. The Opportunity Class Placement Test will be held on **Wednesday 26 July 2017**.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 5 opportunity class entry in 2018, you need to apply soon. You will need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address).

Detailed instructions on how to apply online will be available from **26 April 2017** in a printed application information booklet and at <https://education.nsw.gov.au/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-5>. The application website opens on **26 April 2017** and closes on **Friday 12 May 2017**. No late applications will be accepted.

There are no paper application forms. If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Unit for assistance after **26 April 2017**.

You must submit only ONE application for each student.

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## National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) 2017

### LETTER TO PARENTS

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In May 2017 the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) will be completed by students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. NAPLAN has the support of all State and Territory Education Ministers and will assess the literacy and numeracy skills of students across Australian schools.

The results of the tests will provide important information to schools about what each student can do, and will be used to support teaching and learning programs. Parents will receive a report indicating their child's level of achievement. Each student's level of achievement will be reported against the national minimum standard.

Student background information (student name, gender, date of birth, language background and Aboriginality) will be collected as part of the National Assessment Program. This information is treated confidentially and held securely to ensure that every student's right to privacy is maintained.

The NAPLAN tests will be conducted from 9-11 May 2017.

In the Numeracy tests students do not require any measuring tools such as rulers or protractors. In Years 7 and 9 there will be one Numeracy test with two parts: Part A calculator is allowed and Part B where calculators are not to be used. For the calculator test, the student should use the calculator that they currently use at school.

**Friday 12 May** – A 'catch-up' day is scheduled for students who missed a test or were absent on a test day. Students may be considered for exemption from the tests if they:

- are newly arrived in Australia (less than one year before the test) and with a language background other than English, **or**
- have significant intellectual disability and/or significant co-existing conditions which severely limit their capacity to participate in the tests.

All other students are expected to participate in the tests. Disability adjustments which reflect the student's normal level of support in the classroom may be provided. Large print, Braille, coloured paper versions and electronic tests are available to meet the needs of individual students.

Access to disability adjustments or exemption from the tests must be discussed with the school principal and a parent or carer consent form must be signed.

Students may be withdrawn from NAPLAN by their parent or carer. This is a matter for consideration by parents in consultation with the school principal. If you wish to withdraw your child from the tests, a parent or carer consent form must be signed.

Please make an appointment with the principal of the school your child attends if you would like to discuss your child's participation in NAPLAN.

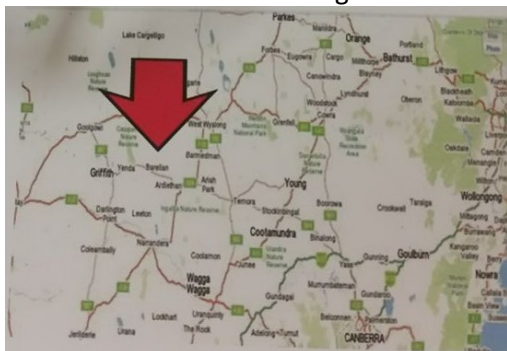

Eligibility criteria apply. A recent Centrelink Income Statement is required at time of application. Spectacles can only be supplied by Optometrists/Optical Dispensers that are registered with the **NSW Spectacles Program**.

## NSW Spectacles Program – Information Sheet

The NSW Spectacles Program funds free glasses and optical aids to financially disadvantaged residents of NSW. Funded by the NSW Department of Family and Community Services and administered by Vision Australia, the Program provides funding to participating optometrists and optical dispensers (providers) to supply optical aids to eligible applicants free of charge. The Program's aim is to improve vision and avoid preventable decline in eye health.

### Who is eligible for this Program?

The Program is available to people who meet the following requirements:

<b>Residency</b>	Are an Australian resident living permanently in NSW
<b>Assets</b>	Have less than \$500 of total assets (if single) OR Have less than \$1,000 in total family assets (if partnered or a single parent)  Household and motor vehicle are not included in these asset restrictions
<b>Income</b>	Receive a full (non-reduced) Commonwealth pension or income support payment <u>AND</u> receive no additional income (other than Centrelink payments) OR Are a low income earner with net income no greater than the full Newstart allowance (if under retirement age) or the full aged pension (if over retirement age)
<b>Other schemes</b>	Are ineligible to receive free optical appliances under any other program (e.g. Department of Veterans' Affairs)
<b>Time period</b>	Have not received spectacles or other optical appliances under the Program within the past two years.

Special conditions exist to provide for single parents receiving maintenance, residents of remote areas, or return applicants experiencing a significant change in vision within two years. Contact our office for more information.

### What does the Program provide?

If you meet the Program's eligibility requirements, you are entitled, in any two-year period, to receive:

- One pair of single vision spectacles; or
- One pair of bifocal spectacles.

The Program may fund other items including contact lenses, tinted lenses or low vision aids, depending on individual clinical needs.



These items are provided free of charge to eligible applicants. When accessing this service, you can choose to pay an additional fee for items that the Program does not fund. Common items that attract a cost include:

- Multifocal or progressive lenses
- Transition or photochromatic coatings
- Non-standard frames

If you choose to pay a co-contribution toward items not available through the Program, you should enquire with your provider about the cost before your order is placed.

## How to apply

As part of your application, you will need to provide:

- Personal details, including contact details and Medicare card number
- A Centrelink Income Statement that is no more than three months old, if receiving Centrelink payments;  
OR
- A payslip and a bank statement that are no more than three months old, if a low income earner.

Centrelink Income Statements can be obtained by phoning or visiting a Centrelink branch, or logging on to Centrelink online.

Once you have obtained the relevant documents, you can lodge an application with a registered Program Provider. First, make an appointment with your chosen provider. When booking an appointment, check whether the provider will need to examine your eyes, or whether you should bring a prescription with you. You should also check whether or not any eye examination can be billed through Medicare. Prescriptions filled through the Program must be no more than three months old. Most providers participating in the Program are optometrists who can conduct your eye examination and provide you with a current prescription.

At your appointment, your provider will supply the terms and conditions for participating in the Program. This will explain privacy conditions for the protection of your personal information and any action Vision Australia or the NSW government may take to verify information provided in your application.

You will be asked to provide verbal consent to the terms and conditions, and a verbal declaration that the information you have provided is true and correct. The provider will enter your details into the NSW Spectacles Program online portal and lodge your application using the documentation you supply. Once your application has been approved, the Provider will order your spectacles or optical aids and let you know when they are ready to collect.
