- spell out loud and take a step for each word spelt correctly

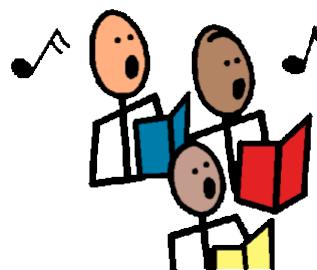

Dear Parents/Guardians,

**RE: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability** Our school is taking part in the nationally consistent collection of data on school students with disability (NCCD).

**What is the NCCD?**

The NCCD is aimed at providing all Australian schools, education authorities and the community with a clear picture of the number of students with disability in schools and the adjustments they require to enable them to participate in education on the same basis as other students.

**What will the data collection involve?**

Like last year, the data collection will involve the collection of the following information at the school level:

- the number of students receiving adjustments to enable them to participate in education on the same basis as other students
- the level of adjustment provided (quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive adjustment); and
- the student's category of disability.

Once this data has been collated, our school will de-identify the data so that no student names are captured before providing to the Australian Government Department of Education. No names or identifying information are collected as part of the collection process.

"A student is eligible to be counted in the NCCD where there is evidence at the school that the student has been provided with an Adjustment/s for a minimum period of 10 weeks of school education (excluding school holiday periods), in the 12 months preceding the relevant reference date for the 2017 NCCD." *Guidelines for the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability 2017*

**What will the data be used for?**

The Australian Government Department of Education will use the information collected for the purposes of preparing reports for briefing Education Ministers.

The NCCD data is designed to inform policy development and future planning to better equip schools and education authorities/sectors to support students with disability that have additional learning needs. This information will have implications for funding for *our* school to better support students who require adjustments to the curriculum.

For the purposes of preparing these reports or briefing material, the Australian Government Department of Education will ensure that the data is aggregated sufficiently so that no student's identity could reasonably be ascertained. The aggregated data held by the Australian Government Department of Education may also be used to inform policy development for future funding and other policy requirements.

**Your child's data**

If you do not want our school to provide de-identified data about your child to the Australian Government Department of Education, you can 'opt-out' by completing and returning the attached opt-out form to the school or contacting the school on the number below. If you do not advise that you wish to opt-out, de-identified information about your child will be included in the data collection.

## Make Online Payments to BCS

It is now possible for parents to make online payments to the school for amounts owing for students, via a secure payment page hosted by Westpac. Payments can be made using either a Visa or MasterCard credit or debit card, and can be made via computer, tablet or mobile phone. The payment page is accessed from the front page of the schools website by selecting [\\$ Make a payment](#)

Items that can be paid include voluntary school contributions, subject contributions, excursions, sales to students and creative and practical arts activities (these include band, drama and dance). There is also a category called 'Other' this to cover items not covered in the previous headings, Other can be used to make a complete payment of a school invoice.

When you access the [\\$ Make a payment](#) you must enter:

- the students name, and
- class and reference number OR
- the students name, and
- date of birth.

These details are entered each time you make a payment as student information is not held within the payment system. **There is also the option to enter the Student Registration Number and Invoice number if you are aware of them, these are optional fields OR there is also the option to enter the Student Registration Number and Invoice number these are not used at our school, please leave blank.**

This is a secure payment system hosted by Westpac to ensure that your credit/debit card details are captured in a secure manner, these details are not passed back to the school.

You have the ability to check and change any details of the payment before the payment is processed. Receipts can be emailed and/or printed.

Details of the payments are passed daily to the school where they will be receipted against your child's account. As a receipt has been issued from the payment page a further receipt will not be issued by the school.
