BCS are celebrating

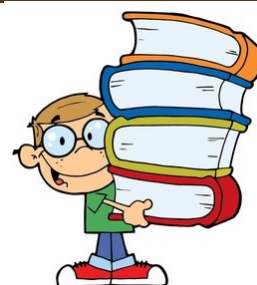
Book Week

Tuesday 5th September

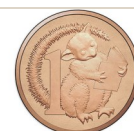
Primary students are welcome to dress up in their favourite book theme.

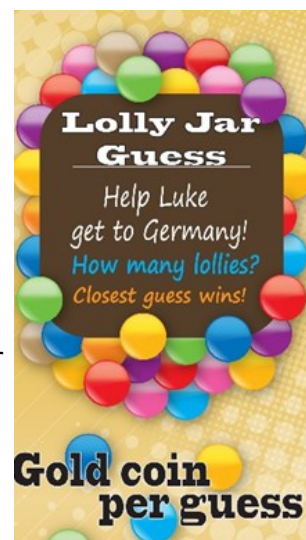

On Wednesday 9th August RAP was represented by 7 boys at Leeton for the first two rounds of the CHS Knockout. RAP played Leeton in the first round and we got off to a fantastic start with Jack, Connor and Bryce combining well having played together in the Open team earlier in the year. Jack got some nice baskets earlier in the match getting us out to a handy lead. Noah was quick to get into the action with some more great lay ups. Tait was showing great support with Jack in defending the key and the two of them worked together really well to diffuse Leeton's attack and collect the rebounds. Bryce and Jackson worked hard to stop the attack from sneaking around the baseline. Abe and Connor were in the face of the Leeton ball carriers and hustled the ball all the way down the court. RAP were in the lead by 2 at half time which we were really excited about. Leeton came out after half time and started to be a little more patient with their passes working their way back into the lead. In the last quarter, we decided to press really hard for the win. Unfortunately, with 2-3 minutes to go Tait rolled his ankle and we were unable to peg back the last 4 points and went down 36-32. This was the closest we have come to Leeton in the boys for about 8 years- Leeton were the eventual winner of the day! The Leeton coach came and complemented the boys on the improvement they have made.

We then took on Griffith High and with Tait no longer in action due to a sprained ankle we knew this would make it tough as we were down to one bench player. This meant that everyone had to lift and do a lot more running. Abe was fantastic chasing the ball in defence all the way to the basket. In attack we had developed more confidence to drive the ball into the key for layups and were able to share the scoring around the team. Bryce took a loose elbow and bit the inside of his mouth drawing blood and had to sit the rest of the quarter out leaving us with no subs. The boys worked hard to help set Jackson up for his first basket. But by the fourth quarter the game had started to drift away from us with the boys becoming tired. In the end we went down 51-26.

Our last game was against Narrandera who came out of the blocks quickly catching us napping. We regrouped and started to chip back the lead. Then Narrandera still having a fresh bench swapped 4 fresh players in and then we knew things were going to get tough. Abe, Connor and Bryce must have ran 30km between them that game running from end to end trying to turn the ball over and get back to help in attack. Abe was still yet to score so we started a plan to help get the ball to him inside the key. After a few missed shots late in the game he got his basket and we all got very excited for him. By the end of the game the boys were all exhausted and went down 71- 36. Our top point scorer of the day was Jack with the most baskets in all three games. Thank you to Mrs McCormack, Mrs Snaith and Mrs Hughes for transporting the boys across. Make Online Payments to BCS

It is now possible for parents to make online payments to the school for amounts owing for students, via a secure payment page hosted by Westpac. Payments can be made using either a Visa or MasterCard credit or debit card, and can be made via computer, tablet or mobile phone. The payment page is accessed from the front page of the school's website by selecting [\\$ Make a payment](#)

Items that can be paid include voluntary school contributions, subject contributions, excursions, sales to students and creative and practical arts activities (these include band, drama and dance). There is also a category called 'Other' this to cover items not covered in the previous headings, Other can be used to make a complete payment of a school invoice.

When you access the [\\$ Make a payment](#) you must enter:

- the students name, and
- class and reference number OR
- the students name, and
- date of birth.

These details are entered each time you make a payment as student information is not held within the payment system. **There is also the option to enter the Student Registration Number and Invoice number if you are aware of them, these are optional fields OR there is also the option to enter the Student Registration Number and Invoice number these are not used at our school, please leave blank.**

This is a secure payment system hosted by Westpac to ensure that your credit/debit card details are captured in a secure manner, these details are not passed back to the school.

You have the ability to check and change any details of the payment before the payment is processed. Receipts can be emailed and/or printed.

Details of the payments are passed daily to the school where they will be receipted against your child's account. As a receipt has been issued from the payment page a further receipt will not be issued by the school.
