#### Planning for 2019

We are acutely aware of the importance of a smooth transition for all students at the beginning of a new school year. We are currently gathering lots of evidence of student learning and ensuring we analyse it and give teachers time to plan for the beginning of 2019. At the end of this year, all teachers will be participating in primary or secondary teacher planning days where every student will be discussed and plans put in place to support their learning, by their teacher for 2019. Whilst final staffing numbers for 2019 are determined by actual student enrolments at the beginning of next year, we are doing everything we can to offer students and their families stability in knowing what will happen by the end of this year.

#### School clean up
