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## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

### Welcome back

Welcome back to a new term. As with most new terms, there are changes, two of which I'm excited to announce. Mat will assist us with a whole range of wellbeing initiatives to support our students. Mat's first initiative is starting a breakfast club. The breakfast club will operate on Mondays from 8am, starting on Monday 30 July.

### Anti-bullying plan – thank you

I would like to thank the parents, students and staff for their participation in developing the Anti-bullying policy. At the conclusion of the information sessions, all parents were surveyed and they indicated the following:

- All parents agreed that the anti-bullying plan is needed.
- All parents were satisfied with the anti-bullying plan
- 63% of parents strongly agree and 37% agree that the plan will help address bullying.
- Parents also made a range of insightful comments about areas we can address to support student wellbeing, including focusing on mental health, developing a caring culture, creating opportunities for friendship and belonging, as well as supporting students' social skills.

I'd also like to remind the school community that bullying is behaviour that is deliberate, repeated, an abuse of power and designed to hurt a specific person or group of people. Please report bullying directly to the school using the referral form that is in the Gazette. You can also access the Anti-bullying plan and referral form on the school's website.

Now that reports have all been received and processed by families, we invite you to come to the school and discuss our collective plans for supporting your child at a parent teacher afternoon/evening on Monday 6 August from 3:30-6:00pm. # Head Teacher Secondary Studies Report

Welcome back to term 3, an extremely busy time for secondary students, especially our year 12 students, who will be completing their schooling at the end of the term and preparing for their HSC examinations.

Congratulations to all year 10 students who have now achieved the national minimum standard in reading and numeracy. Students completed these tests last term and have been successful, meaning they are eligible for the HSC in 2020.

## Subject Selections

Over the coming month, students in year 10 will be involved in choosing the subjects they will study for their senior years. Year 9 students also have the opportunity to begin studying Preliminary subjects as part of the Trade Training Centre days they attend on Tuesdays, so the information provided will also be relevant for these students. The first step in this process will involve receiving a booklet with all available subjects offered through the RAP program on the 30<sup>th</sup> of July. Students and parents are encouraged to read this information carefully. Students and parents will then attend an individual interview with Mrs Wozniak, Careers Adviser, and Ms Forner, HTSS, in order to discuss subject choices that will align best to their ideas about future career paths. A general information evening will be held on 14<sup>th</sup> August for parents of year 9/10 students about their transition into senior school and the RAP program in 2019. Subject selection forms are due on the 17<sup>th</sup> of August. These are important choices and I encourage students and parents to contact me or Mr Clough, ISAC, at any time to discuss queries about subject choices or the operation of the RAP program.

Students in year 8 and 9 will also be selecting the electives they will study next year. They will receive information about these electives later in the term.

## Education Week

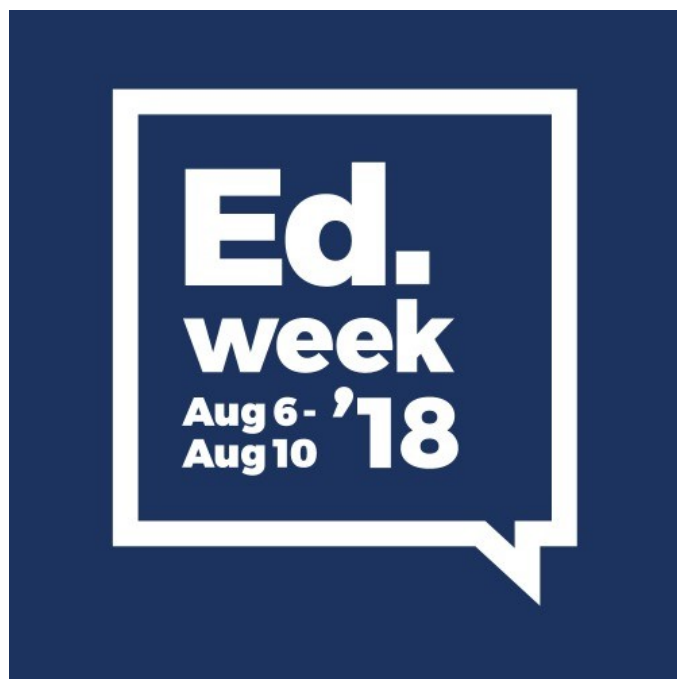


## Book Reviews

2/3/4- are required to read 20 books. Lily 18, Tom 14, Xavier 19, Zeek 15.



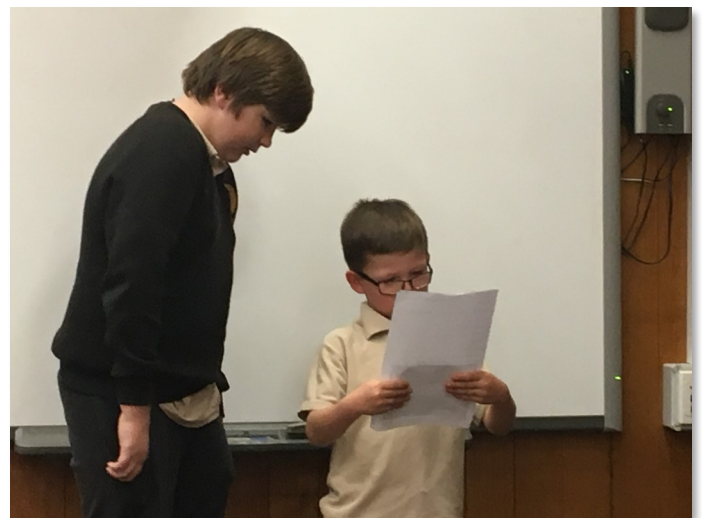
