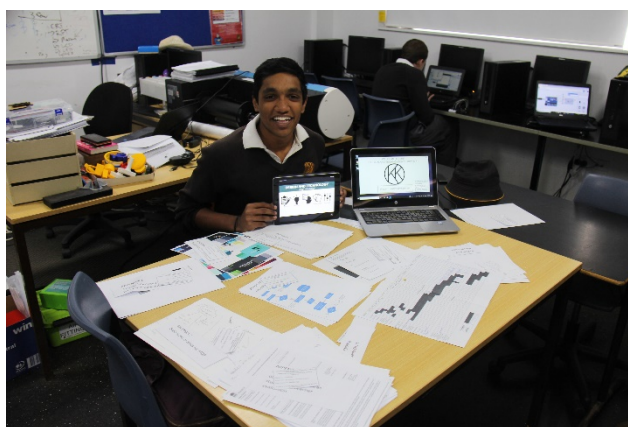


PBL Assembly

EOI - Pilot Run for Backflow Prevention Devices in Barellan



Goldenfields Water are seeking 5 – 10 customers, who live in the township of Barellan to assist with 'Backflow Prevention Device' testing.

A Backflow Prevention Device stops the reverse flow of water from entering our water supply system. As properties in the Barellan township have a 'potable' (drinking quality) and 'non-potable' (non-drinking quality) water connection, these backflow devices will be a requirement as they provide a 'break' between the two connections, eliminating the possibility of non-potable water entering the potable water system and contaminating it.

To ensure the backflow prevention devices won't cause significant pressure reduction issues, Goldenfields Water is seeking 5-10 customers that live in the township of Barellan, have a potable and non-potable water connection, and are willing to have a device installed on their property for a period of 4 weeks. During the testing phase, Goldenfields Water staff will conduct non-invasive pressure testing around their property and would require the participating customers to fill out a questionnaire at the completion of the trial.

Safer Drivers Course @ Narrandera



5 HOURS = 20 LOG BOOK HOURS

Narrandera Shire Council is supporting NRMA Safer Driving - Wagga Wagga to provide the Safer Drivers Course locally on 19-20 October 2019.

Learner Drivers will receive 20 hours of log book credit when they complete the five hour Safer Drivers Course.

The Safer Drivers Course helps young drivers on their L-plates prepare for driving solo when they graduate to provisional licences. To complete the course, you must be on your L-plates, aged under 25 and have completed at least 50 log book hours of driving (including some night driving).

The course consists of two modules. Module 1 is the group discussion with a maximum of twelve learners. Learning is similar to a classroom environment. Module 2 is the in-car practical learning with a qualified driving instructor and another student.

Module 1 will be delivered 9.30am-12.30pm Saturday. Participants will have a session for module 2 scheduled on either Saturday afternoon or Sunday morning.

The course costs \$140. Disadvantaged learners may be eligible to attend the course for free.
