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#### **Principal's Report**

#### School Plan 2021-2024 - Survey

You should have received a letter in the mail regarding a parent survey for the school. We will start calling all families from next Monday to conduct a brief survey about your views and hopes as parents for your children at BCS. This information is very important for us, and we appreciate your time to complete the survey.

#### **UNSW Research Project**

The Gonski Institute is affiliated with the UNSW and will be conducting a research project into rural education. Their lens is very strongly on equity in education, so our voice on this research project is very exciting. We are one of many rural schools involved. The initial stages will involve conducting an interview with me, followed up by surveys across the school. We will be sending home information regarding this research project early next week.

#### HSC

Our HSC students are about halfway through their examinations now. Please continue to be aware that this may be a difficult time for some HSC students, so a little extra understanding will be important for them.

#### **Book Week and NAIDOC week**

In a disrupted year some events from earlier in the year have had to be rescheduled. As we have restrictions increasingly relaxed we are able to run these events that earlier weren't possible.

We will be celebrating Book Week next week, with the Book Parade on Wednesday. It won't be quite the same without parents and guests, however students will still have the chance to dress up next Wednesday, and to celebrate the magic of reading.

In week 5 we will be celebrating NAIDOC week, with the theme Always Was, Always Will Be, which celebrates that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people have occupied and cared for Australia for over 65 000 years.

#### **Aboriginal Education Program**

We are thrilled to welcome Matt Daniels, Aboriginal Community Liaison Officer (ACLO) who is working with our students on Aboriginal Education programs every Friday for the rest of the year. Initially he is working directly with our Aboriginal students on a cultural knowledge program. This program will continue to grow as we develop the knowledge and leadership skills of our Aboriginal students who will share their new cultural understanding with the rest of the school community.

## LIBRARY LOOP

Dear Parents and Guardians,

Our Scholastic Book Fair commenced on Tuesday 27th October 2020 and will go through to Thursday 5th November 2020. The following options are ways parents and students can make payments.

**Option 1** - Students can purchase books at school with cash during designated times which are lunch 2 and 3pm to 3:25pm.

**Option 2** - Students will bring home a wish list with the book name and price. You can use that to follow the pre-payment instructions to make a payment (as seen below). Students then return the wish list and receipt number to the school office and the books will be sent home.

**Option 3** - Students will bring home a wish list with the book name and price. You can use that to send cash into the Book Fair in an envelope clearly labelled with the child's name and class to make a payment. The books will then be sent home.

**Option 4** – Students will bring home a Book Fair catalogue, on the last page there will be an order sheet which includes two payment methods online and cash, once this is filled out it can be returned to the Book Fair and the books will be sent home with the students.
