NSW Health states that routine administration of a COVID-19 vaccine on the same day as any other vaccine is not recommended. The preferred minimal interval between receipt of COVID-19 vaccine and any other vaccine is 7 days. Considering these recommendations, the date Year 7 students are now scheduled to receive their 2nd dose Gardisal (HPV vaccine) is the 18th of October 2021 at Barellan Central School. Therefore, any students in Year 7 that receive a COVID-19 on or after the 11th of October 2021 will not be able to receive their routine 2nd dose of Gardisal (HPV vaccine) on the 18th of October at the school vaccination clinic, they will need to attend their GP 7 days following receipt of the COVID-19 vaccine or as soon as possible thereafter to receive it.

Finally, we have received our results for the 2021 School Merino Wether Challenge. Just to refresh everyone's memory, the challenge involved the school taking on 6 merino wethers to for 5 months, with the students involved in the day-to-day care of the animals. The sheep were then grouped into Team A and B and were returned to Dubbo for final judging.

It has been exciting to announce that our school has placed overall 10th for Wool Value, which is an incredible achievement to compete against 60 other schools! Specifically, two of our sheep placed 2nd and 3rd individually for their wool value - just a shame that they weren't grouped together as we would have placed significantly higher! Sheep 310 (3rd place) had a micron of 14.8 and fleece weight of 4.1 kg, and sheep 307 (2nd place) had a micron of 16 and fleece weight of 5.05.

Thank you for the people who have donated their time and resources to support this challenge.
