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Principal's Report

COVID update

As you are all aware, from the 8 November we have had a number of changes to our COVID-safe operations, and we have been able to open up more as a school. Whilst there are still restrictions about how we manage school events, excursions and assemblies are now possible with COVID safe practices such as reduced cohorts involved at any given time and with exclusive use of outdoor venues.

All school staff are now double vaccinated, and I'd like to publicly thank our staff for their willingness to getting vaccinated as the best way to protect themselves and the most vulnerable in our community.

Plans are in place for Presentation Night on Tuesday 14 December, however at this stage we are still not permitted a public audience or mixing of cohorts. We will carefully monitor restrictions and make a decision about the format in the coming weeks.

From 8 November

All schools will operate on updated Level 3 settings for the rest of Term 4.

- School sports allowed
- Inter-school sports allowed outside of school hours
- Assemblies and presentations allowed outdoors on-site
- Excursions allowed outdoors
- Dancing and some music classes allowed
- Fully vaccinated visitors allowed on site to support curriculum delivery, wellbeing programs and school operations
- Community use allowed (including P&C meetings)

The key consideration for us as a school is that regular attendance at school strongly supports students' academic achievement.

Remembrance Day



On the 11th hour, of the 11th day, of the 11th month, we take a moment to remember and observe the significance of the sacrifice made by those serving on the Western Front. This year we remember the interring of the Unknown Australian Soldier, 28 years ago, in the Hall of Memory at the Australian War Memorial in Canberra.

We do not know this Australian's name and we never will. We do not know his rank or battalion. We do not know where he was born, nor precisely how he died ... We will never know who this Australian was ... he was one of the 45,000 Australians who died on the Western Front ... one of the 60,000 Australians who died on foreign soil. One of the 100,000 Australians who died in wars this century. He is all of them. And he is one of us. — Paul Keating 'Eulogy for the Unknown Soldier'
