Principal's Report

After stepping away from school whilst on leave it's been delightful to return and see the school through a fresh lens. Today I will give you a brief staffing update and share what I'll call normalised excellence.

Staffing update

As the term draws to an end we will be saying good bye to two teachers, Miss Rebecca Marquardt (PDHPE) and Mrs Carolyn Gladwin (Learning and Support). We wish them the very best as they head off on their new adventure's interstate.

We are looking forward to welcoming Mr John Millis. I've met with Mr Millis and am excited about his arrival. He brings most welcome expertise in Agriculture and Technology as well as a passion for Science. We look forward very much to his leadership in the Ag program.

Unfortunately, we have been unsuccessful in recruiting a Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE) teacher at this stage. Current senior students studying PDHPE will continue to have their courses taught by a specialist PDHPE teacher through the Riverina Access Partnership and Distance Education. We will continue the recruitment process next term; I appreciate your patience whilst we continue the search for a qualified PDHPE teacher.

We will soon commence the formal process to recruit a permanent Head Teacher Welfare.

As part of the process the school seeks a parent representative for the selection panel, which is nominated through the P&C association.

I would also like to ensure that you are aware that Barellan Central now hosts the Assistant Principal Learning and Support, Kerri Daly. Mrs Daly works across 20 schools in West Wyalong network which extends from Bedgerabong in the North East, across to Rankin Springs in the West and as far south as Barellan. Mrs Daly's work is based around providing additional specialist support for learning and support teams, and we welcome her expertise to support our team at BCS.

Normalised excellence

Over the last two weeks I've enjoyed spending time in classes in lots of different ways, such as being interviewed by the K/1/2 class about life in the olden days (back before colour was invented!) to observing a debate in the 4/5/6 class about the best location at school for their new artworks that are being co-designed with the creativity and vision of Carol Evans, whose contribution and generosity is always appreciated – thank you Carol!

I loved meeting with the secondary captains and discussing their vision for the school and how they are enacting their leadership for real benefits for all students, such as leading different fund-raising activities to construct new cricket nets and running dance activities for a range of students.

Thank you to our captains Isabel Harris and Anika Praestiin in secondary and Ellie Haddrill and Billy Irons in primary for your leadership of the SRC under the tutelage of Mrs Julie Kenny.

Students at BCS have enjoyed a range of extracurricular experiences over the last two weeks including a Circus day for all students, the principal from the Riverina Environmental Education Centre Mr Darron Watt running geography skills workshops with our secondary students, welcoming a rugby development officer to work with our primary students and participating in sporting competitions such as RAP soccer and tennis matches. Thank you to the teachers for making these opportunities possible.

Something that has been evident for me over the last week in particular has been the ever growing expertise of our learning support officers Mrs P, Karen and Kristi who have been expertly running literacy and numeracy groups, providing personalised support for so many of our students. With our committed teachers and support officers working directly with all students in small classes, you can be confident of the personal attention that every student receives to support their learning every day.

Finally, I encourage those of you in town to join the school's Anzac Day representation on Anzac Day on the final Tuesday before returning to school meeting at the community hall at 2:30pm for a 3:00pm commencement.


