4/5/6 Field of Mars Incursion

On Tuesday 28th February, we welcomed Julie-Ann from Field of Mars Environmental Education Centre, Sydney to engage students in a hands-on experience combining English, Science and Geography skills in the 'Campaign' incursion.

Campaigns use powerful persuasive texts to captivate and position their target audiences. During this incursion students used a range of video making equipment, including iPads, to develop a sustainability campaign, incorporating sound and persuasive words to inspire, motivate and educate.

Students learnt all about persuasive devices, camera angles and emotive language and music to connect with and convince their target audience. They were engaged in a variety of hands-on activities throughout the day and had a lot of fun learning new persuasive techniques.

They explored how point of view is shaped in environmental campaigns through digital camera work, editing and persuasive text to construct a communication product intended to convince students at BCS to stop littering and to encourage community members to come and try our fresh produce from Kenny's shack.

K/I/2 Field of Mars Incursion

On Wednesday, K/1/2 took part in an incursion that was run by the Field of Mars Environmental Education Centre, and as you can see from the pictures, we loved it!

It was all about invertebrates (animals that don't have a spine), which tied in perfectly with our Science strand for Term 1 – Living things.

We kicked off the incursion by going to the garden and learning about several techniques to finding and catching invertebrates. We learnt how to dig for bugs in the leaf litter, how to catch flying bugs using a sweeper, and how to find creepy crawlies on vegetation by placing a white tarpaulin underneath a bush, and shaking them onto it.

Every child managed to find an invertebrate, and by the end of the "hunt," we had a collection of praying mantises, bees, worms, and beetles.

After catching them, we went back to the classroom and learnt how to draw scientific pictures of our bugs. The children then sketched these onto Styrofoam, covered them in black ink, and printed them onto some coloured paper to produce some pop art insects!

All in all, a very productive day!


In class we have been learning how to use Canva and create album artworks.
