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Principals Report

Final Gazette for the year

What a fantastic year it has been. Thank you all for your amazing support—it means so much to our school community. Personally, this year, I loved getting back into the classroom teaching French. As principals, we often spend a lot of time on admin tasks, but every principal in NSW Public Schools started as an experienced classroom teacher.

One challenge that stood out for me this year was attendance. Regular attendance is so important. When students miss school, they miss out—not just on learning, but on all the other good things that come with it. When kids succeed at school, they feel motivated. That motivation makes them happier and more confident, which helps their mental health, too. It's a win-win.

Sometimes, I hear families talk about giving students a "mental health day." While it sounds like a good idea, taking too many days off can actually make things harder for kids. It can lead to falling behind in class, losing connections with friends, and feeling even more stressed.

The best way to support our kids' mental health is to help them experience success at school. Regular attendance makes that possible.





Barellan Central School School holiday works notification – Summer | 2024/25

We regularly inspect and maintain schools to ensure the safety and wellbeing of our school communities.

The school holidays are the ideal time for a lot of maintenance and project work to take place across the state without disrupting learning.

We will be carrying out asbestos removal work at Barellan Central School from Tuesday 7 January to Friday 10 January 2025.

Background

A staff member identified damaged ceiling sheets – known to contain bonded asbestos – in the visual art classroom demountable on 7 February 2024.

NSW Health explains living or working with asbestos, or just being around it, is a low risk to your health as long as the asbestos is in good condition and not damaged.

- **February 7:** The room was made inaccessible to students and staff and a contractor encapsulated all exposed edges on the damaged ceiling
- **February 13:** Testing by an independent hygienist confirmed the presence of bonded asbestos, as listed in the school's asbestos register
- February 20: The independent hygienist provided test results and recommended future asbestos removal. The area will remain cordoned off until the asbestos removal work is completed.

Works overview

- replacement of asbestos-containing ceiling sheets with coloured corrugated iron sheets
- removal and replacement of air-conditioning units, light fittings, ceiling fans, light switches and associated cabling.

Asbestos removal works will take place in accordance with work health and safety laws and the NSW Department of Education's Asbestos Management Plan.

Safety measures, including air monitoring, will be in place while work was being done.

All work will be completed by licensed asbestos contractors and monitored by independent hygienists.

The independent hygienist will inspect the classroom to confirm it has been fully remediated and issue a clearance certificate before the space is reopened ahead of Day 1 Term 1 2025.

The health, safety, and wellbeing of the school and the local community is our highest priority.

Getting on Track in Time - Got It!

Got It! is an early intervention social and emotional learning program supported by the NSW Ministry of Health, and the NSW Department of Education. Your school has the opportunity to participate in this exciting program in 2025.

The *Got It!* team will be working with children in 2025 Kindergarten to Year 2, aged 5-8 years (Early Stage One and Stage One) and their parents, who may be experiencing difficulties with challenging and disruptive behaviour – at home or at school. The program will give families the opportunity to be part of a fun and supportive group that can improve child behaviour and family relationships, and help parents deal with difficult behaviours. For some of these families this may include a 10 week group program.

Challenging social and emotional difficulties often cause problems in many areas of a child's life. It can also be stressful for their family, friends and community. Sadly, these children can be seen as 'naughty', rather than as children who are struggling with organising their thoughts, feelings and behaviours.

Got It! aims to provide support and practical help to children and their families, and also to support the school community to help children get the most out of the opportunities available to them.

The *Got It!* team is looking forward to working with your school during the rest of this year and throughout 2025. We would like to thank the whole school community for your commitment to improving the wellbeing of children and families.

<u>All</u> families will be asked to complete a questionnaire for each child starting Kindergarten, Year 1 and Year 2 in 2025. The questionnaires for the children currently in Kindergarten and Year 1 will be coming home with your child soon. Please help us by returning this form ASAP. Got It! staff will be available at your school to help with this.
