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### **Principals Report**

## Establishment of a Barellan, Ardlethan and Ariah Park Aboriginal Education Consultative Group (AECG)

I'm thrilled the share with you that on the 10 April at 4:00pm there will be a meeting of the Aboriginal parents and families from the Ardlethan, Ariah Park and Barellan communities to establish a local AECG. The meeting will take place at Ardlethan Central School. There will also be an option to join via Teams.

AECG meetings provide opportunities for Aboriginal people to be actively involved in all decision-making that is relevant to education and training through a collaborative consultative process.

We will be contacting our Aboriginal families over the next week with more information about joining the meetings.

### **NAPLAN**

We are currently in the middle of the annual NAPLAN testing period. As always, I remind you that these assessments are a snapshot in time of how your child is performing. The preparations at this point should be the normal preparations for school; all students need to sleep well, read regularly, eat well, and come to school refreshed.

#### Homework

Homework matters for students, but its effect isn't straightforward for all students.

For younger students, homework really only needs to be regular reading and doing

something that helps them develop a positive attitude towards school.

In secondary school however homework is increasingly important for regular revision and consolidation of learning that takes place at school. All secondary students in years 7-10 have a homework policy in their notebooks, which has been signed by parents. Please support your child by regularly checking their books at home and directing them to complete all homework assigned in class.

We all had a great time in Sydney exploring the city and listening to some fantastic speakers and we are all excited to spread the knowledge that we learnt on the day.














Provide your consent for routine school vaccinations online

### To provide online consent, you will need:

- to visit: <a href="https://engage.health.">https://engage.health.</a> nsw.gov.au/engage
- · your Service NSW log-in details
- medicare card details for you and your child – the name of the high school your child is attending in 2024.

If you or your child do not have a medicare card, you can provide consent using a paperbased consent form at your child's school.

### **NSW SCHOOL VACCINATION PROGRAM**

In 2024 the following vaccines will be offered:

- <u>Year 7 students:</u> are offered free vaccines for diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis (dTpa) and human papillomavirus (HPV).
- Year 10 students: are offered free meningococcal ACWY vaccine.

If your child is in Year 7 or Year 10 this year, you can now provide online consent for their routine school vaccinations. Vaccination will only be provided at school if consent has been received.

#### **How to Provide Consent:**

- To complete online consent for your child's school vaccinations, visit: https://engage.health.nsw.gov.au/engage
- 2. For detailed steps on how to provide consent please refer to the NSW Health webpage: <u>How to Provide Consent.</u>
- 3. Follow the steps to log in to your existing ServiceNSW account. This is the same account you may already use to renew your driver's licence. If you don't have a ServiceNSW account, refer to ServiceNSW to create one.
- 4. Update or confirm your personal details in ServiceNSW as required.
- 5. Complete the School Vaccination Consent Form for your child/ren. You will need to:
  - a) Enter your child's personal details.
  - b) Provide the Medicare card details for you and your child.
  - c) Read the linked <u>Parent Information Sheet and privacy statement. Translations available in 27 languages.</u>
  - d) Provide consent.

If you or your child do not have a Medicare card, or you are not able to provide consent on-line, consent can still be provided by requesting a paper-based consent form directly from your child's school office.

#### The benefits of providing consent online:

- easily update your child's details.
- receive SMS and/or email notifications when vaccinations are given.
- faster upload of vaccination records to the Australian Immunisation Register (AIR).
